An Act to amend the Sale of Goods (Weights and Measures) Ordinance

[.....]

ENACTED by the Parliament of Tanganyika.

1. This Act may be cited as the Sale of Goods (Weights and Measures) Ordinance (Amendment) Act, 1964, shall be read as one with the Sale of Goods (Weights and Measures) Ordinance (hereinafter called the Ordinance) and shall come into operation on such date as the Minister may, by notice in the *Gazette*, appoint.

2. Section 2 of the Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting therefrom the definition "made-up goods" and substituting therefor the following new definition:—

"made-up goods" means goods which are packed or made up in advance ready for sale and includes any such goods which are packed in a wrapper or container, made up in a roll, bale or bundle or wound on a reel or spool, and where any goods so packed, made up or wound are found on any premises where such articles are packed, kept or stored for sale, they shall be deemed to be packed or made up in advance ready for sale unless the contrary is proved;".

3. The First Schedule to the Ordinance is hereby amended by adding to the list of items contained therein the following:—


"3. Oils intended for human consumption and extracted from groundnuts, simsim, cotton seed, copra or palm nuts, but excluding clarified butter and ghee. 36 lb. net."

“8. Sewing, knitting and embroidery cottons.”
