An Act to make provision for the Transfer of the Duties, Powers and Functions of the Solicitor-General

[1ST OCTOBER, 1965]

ENACTED by the Parliament of the United Republic of Tanzania.

1. This Act may be cited as the Solicitor-General (Transfer of Duties Short title and Powers) Act, 1965 and shall be deemed to have come into operation commence on the first day of October, 1965.

2.—(1) Subject to this section, where by or under any written law Duties and any duty is imposed or any power or function is conferred on the functions of Solicitor-General, such duty may be performed and such power or General function may be exercised by the Attorney-General or such legally may be qualified person holding office in the Attorney-General's Chambers as performed the Attorney-General may in writing nominate in that behalf.

(2) Where by or under any written law the Solicitor-General appointed a member of any board, commission or committee—

Attorneyis General or his representative

- (a) together with the Attorney-General, the Attorney-General may, by notice in writing addressed to such board, commission or committee, nominate any legally qualified person holding office in the Attorney-General's Chambers to be such member in place of the Solicitor-General, and upon such nomination such person shall be deemed to have been appointed such member in place of the Solicitor-General;
- (b) in any other case, the Attorney-General may, by notice in writing addressed to such board, commission or committee, nominate either himself or any legally qualified person holding office in the Attorney-General's Chambers to be such member in place of the Solicitor-General, and upon such nomination the Attorney-General or such person, as the case may be, shall be deemed to have been appointed such member in place of the Solicitor-General.

(3) Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this section shall be construed as precluding any person empowered to revoke or amend any subsidiary legislation or appointment, from revoking or amending the same in relation to the Solicitor-General.
